

# Early Detection Works Services

## This program serves people who:

- Don't have health insurance
- Meet the age and income guidelines

## Services may include free:

- Breast cancer screenings (clinical breast exams and mammograms)
- Cervical cancer screenings (Pap and HPV tests)
- Follow-up tests to find out if treatment is needed
- Help with finding resources for treatment



## Early Detection Works Eligibility

This program enrolls Kansans who:

- **Are 21 to 64 years old** for cervical cancer screenings.
- **Are 40 to 64 years old** for breast cancer screenings
  - Those outside these age guidelines with breast or cervical health concerns should call 1-877-277-1368 to find out if resources are available.
- **Do not have health insurance.**
- **Have this much family income or less before taxes:**

Household Size	Monthly Maximum	Annual Maximum
1	\$ 2,658	\$ 31,900
2	\$ 3,592	\$ 43,100
3	\$ 4,525	\$ 54,300
4	\$ 5,458	\$ 65,500
5	\$ 6,392	\$ 76,700

*\*For households with more than 5 persons, add \$11,050 for each additional person. Spring 2019; guidelines updated annually.*

## How to Enroll

Call toll free 1-877-277-1368. If you qualify for this program, you will be given an enrollment number and referred to an Early Detection Works health care provider.

## What if Something is Found?

Early Detection Works pays for most follow-up tests. These tests may help you find out if you have cancer or a pre-cancerous condition. Your health care provider will help arrange follow-up appointments with you.

## If You Need Treatment

Kansas residents diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer through this program are eligible for referral to KanCare (Kansas Medicaid). Other treatment options may be available for those not eligible for KanCare.
